Bargaining

- **BCAA - RACC** – Membership meetings held and generally under-attended; planning on holding a telephone town hall to engage members.
- **BCAA - Service Locations** – Membership meetings held and generally under-attended; planning on holding a telephone town hall to engage members.
- **BC Hydro** – Committee met with Lower Mainland members between March 11 & 20 with town hall meeting held March 21; bargaining dates with employer set for April 16-18 and May 20-24.
- **BC Transit** – Committee met in March to draft proposals.
- **Burnaby English Language Centre** – Parties met March 13; employer will submit proposal to Immigrant Refugee Citizenship Canada for continued funding - our proposals made clear we would be looking for wage increases; parties to meet again April 12.
- **Canadian Freightways** – Parties met March 13 & 14; union will be pursuing wage increases at this round of bargaining; most language changes achieved over the last few sessions.
- **Cascades Casino (Langley)** – Agreement for surveillance operators reached; ratified March 15.
- **CIATU** – Agreement reached; ratified March 18.
- **Coast Mountain Bus** – Committee met in March to review surveys; proposals to be drafted in the coming weeks.
- **Coastal Community Credit Union** – Bargaining committee has been elected; survey results have been tabulated.
- **CRNBC/CRPNBC/CLPNBC** – Successorship (s. 35); new body to be known as BCCNP; reached agreement on successorship; finalizing the document to be issued as an LRB order.

- **Enterprise Rent-A-Car** – Process to select bargaining committee is underway.
- **FortisBC Inc. (Electric)** – Master committee met March 8 to discuss sub-committees.
- **FortisBC Energy Inc.** – Master committee met March 8 to discuss sub-committees.
- **Gulf & Fraser Fishermen's Credit Union** – Committee has met and reviewed survey; membership meeting held March 8; once proposals are drafted and membership meeting held, will contact employer for dates.
- **Hertz (Victoria & Midtown)** – Agreement reached; ratified April 3.
- **ICBC** – Committee spent four days in February drafting proposals; will be back for follow-up session in early April.
- **Island Savings Credit Union** – Survey has been reviewed; membership meeting to be held April 10; proposals to be drafted after that.
- **NDP BC** – Committee has met and are finalizing proposals.
- **Teamsters 155** – Committee met February 26 to review proposals; will schedule a membership meeting soon to review proposals and from there will schedule dates with the employer.
- **TransLink** – Committee scheduled to meet the last two weeks in April to compose proposals.
- **Unifor 114** – Committee has been selected; survey to members March 11.
- **Vancouver Taxi** – Overdue to renew agreement; proposals almost complete; employer has been advised dates need to be set.
- **Westminster Savings Credit Union** – Members remain on strike; employer has not contacted union to return to the table; BBQ and rally held on Saturday, March 16.



Stop Corporate Greed at Westminster Savings

On January 22, MoveUP members working at the Westminster Savings Credit Union Shaughnessy Station branch in Port Coquitlam set up a picket line.

The workers there are fighting for retirement security, and against inequity in the workplace. The employer has been unwilling to budge from a proposal to two-tier their pension that would allow, for the time being, existing employees to retain their existing pension plan but for new employees hired after July 1, 2018 to only have access to an inferior plan.

We are hoping that affiliate members can help support our members on the picket line by:

1. Visiting the picket line during normal hours. Although the employer has chosen to "close" the branch and not serve any of their credit union members there, the picket line is in operation during times that the branch would have normally been open. The hours are as follows:
