ENGLISH TEXT:

Defending Canada’s Public Postal Service

Whereas the government of Canada announced on April 16th the phasing out of service in door to door delivery of mail by Canada Post by early 2027 and;

Whereas Canada Post on April 21st also announced that they would be cutting 30,000 good, unionized jobs by 2030;

Whereas the postal service is a necessary service to the people of Canada, providing good jobs, rural delivery and accessibility to people from coast to coast to coast

Therefore be it resolved that the Canadian Labour Congress (CLC) will work with the Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) to immediately lobby the government to reverse the decision to end door-to-door delivery;

Be it further resolved the CLC will share materials with affiliates and call on them to also support a campaign to reverse these cuts.

Title: Lobby the Federal Government to reinstate the Canada Wide Early Learning Infrastructure Fund

In the April 29th Federal Economic Update, it was identified that the Canada Wide Early Learning Infrastructure Fund funding would sunset at the end of 2026.

We call for the CLC to lobby the federal government to reverse the sunset decision, and provide an immediate further injection of at least \$4 billion in federal funding annually for childcare operations to address and improve retention of those working in ELCC, as well as operate additional spaces expanding over the next five years to meet the needs of the economy and economic growth.

The federal and provincial/territorial governments promised 250,000 additional spaces by March 31, 2026 which has not been met. The update calls for adding another 100,000 trained skilled workers into the paid labour force. Without affordable childcare, young women face significant barriers entering skilled trades.

Canada cannot work without childcare.
